Course: AQA A Level Sociology

Entry Requirements: Grade 5 or above in GCSE English and grade 4 or above in GCSE Maths.

Aims of the Course:

Sociology is the study of the relationship between the individual and society. Have you ever wondered why people exhibit certain behaviour? Who commits crime and why? How do we become the people that we are? At A Level we study the theoretical frameworks and methods that are used by sociologists to study social behaviour.

Course Content:

The AS and the A Level are two separate qualifications, which are examined in June. Students who take the AS Level can then progress to the A Level within one year and students who study for the A Level will also take the AS Level after one year.

Paper 2: Topics within Sociology: Families and Households and Beliefs in Society

Paper 3: Crime and Deviance with Theory and Methods

Written two hour exam

You will complete a minimum of two graded essays per half term. Assessments will be based on content and exam technique in order to prepare students fully for the exams.
